Tuesday's Council Meeting

Tuesday night is a fairly light agenda covering a number of consent agenda items, including exempting need for a sound amplification permit for those events that already go through the special event permit process and the schedule and form for the City Manager annual evaluation. We will also provide a financial report and cover in more detail the shortfall we are seeing in sales tax revenue.

Hundreds of Chickens in the Civic Center

Seriously! We really have over 70+ chickens upstairs right now (another 70 to arrive) for the Poultry Show—new addition to the Mike the Headless Chicken Festival. A variety of prizes will be awarded to these show chickens and well, the worst in show...

We are having a rough start to festivals with the rain this year, but plan to push through it today and hope all will still have a blast. The first band Bicycle Annie decided to move into FATJAR from 5-7 pm and Boogie Machine plans to be outside at the stage. Hope to see you out there this weekend doing the chicken dance, enjoying the tunes, riding the hover board, eating pancakes, checking out the car show, running the race, disc golfing or enjoying the venues. TID BITS:

- We were able to meet with the majority of downtown businesses directly impacted by this summer's streetscape project and will continue to follow-up with the rest. We have received a positive response and excitement to see the first phase completed in July and august. We will keep up communication with the businesses regarding construction schedule in the future. Our bid opening is June 5th. (Check out the Free Press Article on this in Fruita in the News)
- Counselor Fuller and I were able to attend the AGNC meeting the Governor. He was very supportive of AGNC's interests in oil/gas, sage grouse, coal, water, etc. We were also able to meet the new director of DOLA and express our appreciation for our recent grant awards.
- Counselor Mascarenas and I attended the CML Spring Outreach lunch in Grand Junction this week and received a legislative and CML efforts report while sharing what Fruita is working on and learning what other communities are working on.



- Our Police Department took FIRST place in the Bearcat Pull against other area law enforcement agencies benefiting Special Olympics Colorado. (See picture below of the team).
- Crews have done an outstanding job prepping for the festival this week and especially yesterday and today!
- We have continued our meetings with the BLM and are currently discussing a potential MOU with specific ways to partner, be the pilot connecting community and build trails.
- Ottley Avenue now has almost all the south side sidewalk complete.
- The outdoor pool is hosting school swim through next week.
- Parks crews have aerated all city parks.
- Saturday's History Fair hosted 42 adults and many youth—it was a lot of fun.
- Code Enforcement and contracted crews have now worked on Alan Story's property for two
 days so far, completing a large amount of work.
- I was interviewed by a producer with the national television show *City View*. They are looking for communities to highlight in a new series on community quality of life and were interested in Fruita and our festivals, etc.
- The April 2015 STEP report is attached.
- A crime report is attached. Although calls for service have decreased, offenses are up. The increase in drug offenses is a direct result of proactive work the department has been doing.
- A draft of the Chamber's Community Profile is below. This is just a draft and they are still
 making corrections. We have some we have already given them related to sales tax, etc. but I
 know you all were interested.
- So far this year we have had 13 new residential units permitted.
- City Link is off to press and includes a notice calling for photo and logo submissions that will soon be on the website and social media as well. We shared with the Arts and Culture Board and Downtown Advisory Board as well so far.
