Why Fruita?

Check out our new video that Cullen Purser collaborated with us on and created for us just in time to share with the outdoor industry while at OR this week. You can find it at www.fruita.tv.

OR

Mayor Buck and I joined Steve Jozefcyk (GJEP) at the annual Summer Outdoor Retailer show in Salt Lake City this week. We spent two full days promoting Fruita to outdoor gear manufacturers and retailers. We were fortunate to have free registration and access to thousands of companies. The purpose of the show is for retailers of this gear to meet with manufacturers and dealers and place orders of new product in 2016 for their companies. We made a positive impression on many we spoke to who were pleasantly surprised to meet a Mayor and Manager there with a purpose to recruit business to our community. We had many great conversations, gathered a lot of contact information and spread our message of being a wonderland of outdoor activity, ripe for business location and growth for companies who value the outdoor lifestyle. We included the link to www.fruita.tv with a video highlighting Fruita and our opportunity for economic development related to the outdoor industry. It was unfortunate to hear from the vast majority that they manufacture their products overseas claiming costs and quality happen to be better. Although we do not have a list of companies planning an immediate relocation, we planted the seeds and will be actively following up on leads and contacts. We also learned quite a bit about the industry and left with plenty of ideas to pursue.

Joint Economic Development Action Plan & Meeting

In relation to the Competitive Location Assessment Report provided by Chabin Associates (worked with North Star), the "ED Partners" which is the staff of the cities, county, GJ Chamber, Business Incubator Center, Workforce Center and GJEP have worked with Audrey Taylor developing an action plan to address and implement the recommendations of the report. A joint meeting, inviting the executive boards and councils will be held August 20th from 4-6 pm at the Workforce Center and each of you are invited and encouraged to attend. More info to come prior to this.

Drainage

In addition to previous updates on the efforts toward a valley-wide drainage solution, new events continue to occur each week. Quick summary: on May 28, the

cities, county and Drainage District met to receive the recommendations of the white paper, in which staff recommended one entity through legislation to expand the drainage district boundaries, address the make-up and size of the district's board and then implement a fee for service to fund the efforts. Committees were established around governance, finance and operations. The District decided to move forward with a fee a year sooner beginning in 2016 to cover the current boundary. This week Scott McInnis and Duncan McArthur released yesterday a letter to the District Board (attached) and a press release today (attached) calling for restructuring of the Drainage District's Board make-up. I plan to have a staff update on this topic at our August workshop.

TID BITS:

- The chip seal project was completed this week with over 4,700 square yards of chip seal completed. These preventative maintenance measures have proven to reduce our need for crack sealing, patching and other maintenance costs. Good job GMCO and Public Works crews for getting this done. All City streets will be restriped in the next 2 weeks.
- An open house event for the new City Shops building has been scheduled for September 15th
 from 3:00-6:00 pm. This will also coincide with Colorado Cities and Counties Week, so the event
 is planned to include opportunities for residents to come get to know more about the City. Stay
 tuned for details.
- The decommissioned lagoons "turned over" this past week and do not smell very good, which has had a considerable impact on those at the State Park and the school buses parking on the site. Staff expects the smell to subside within the week, but if it doesn't, will look into measures to address the issue.
- Sewer and Drainage completed at West extension on the Ottley phase II project. United
 Companies moved back in on 8/4 to prepare sub grade and place road base. Mays Concrete is
 moving in next week to pour concrete curb and gutter and sidewalk. Project is on schedule for
 end of month (August) completion.
- Underground utilities completed on Peach Street intersection. Mays started wall construction of seat wall foundations this week at Peach. Sorter has been demoing planters, asphalt, and concrete at Mulberry this week and should start underground utilities next week for drainage at Mulberry.
- Sewer service locates were completed by Countryside Services this week and Public Works
 completed potholing of critical utility crossings for the Mulberry sewer project in the CIP for this
 year. Final design should be complete in the next two weeks followed by advertisements for
 bids.
- A Black Elm tree in SE section of Circle Park has deteriorated and will be removed next week. Three new trees have been planted over the past year in that section in anticipation of this tree being removed. The Elm in the center of Reed Park will also be removed for the same reason.
- The last Thursday Night Concert on August 13th will be Finders and Youngberg. It has been yet another great concert season in Fruita.
- Fall program registrations are in Full Swing Youth Soccer, Youth Flag Football, and Adult Volleyball registration are being accepted.

- Also a new athletic program for adults called 'Fall Brawl' is rolling out this fall each week, teams
 will play a different sport participants will play disc golf, volleyball, soccer, dodge ball,
 basketball and kickball.
- City Staff got some great training on Sun Safety. A representative from Sun Safe Colorado presented to staff on how to reduce their risk of skin cancer, etc.
- There was a report that July was the coldest on record FCC attendance definitely reflects that record. In July, there were 18,258 paid visits to the FCC, down 2,589 from July 2014. While the visits were down, 18,000 paid visits is still healthy.
- Total planning clearances issues Jan July were 180 compared to 200 in the same period of 2014; Residential units permitted were 4 in July and 20 for the year compared to 27 for the same period in 2014.

Councilman, Commissioner call for change to Drainage District board Fair representation needed from across Grand Valley

To better represent Mesa County citizens, Mesa County Commissioner Scott McInnis and Grand Junction City Councilman Duncan McArthur are requesting a change to the governance of the Grand Valley Drainage District.

The district includes the communities of Grand Junction, Fruita and Palisade and the unincorporated areas of Mesa County. Since the district's inception in 1915, many changes have occurred. When necessary, legislative modifications have been made.

County and city leaders, among others, have been meeting for months to evaluate the Drainage District and its services with the goal of better meeting drainage and stormwater needs, as well as water quality regulations.

Now, McInnis and McArthur are asking their boards and others to consider the necessary state legislation to restructure the Drainage District's board of directors. The two would like to see the board move from a three-member, elected board to a five-member appointed board. Moving away from elected board members is important, they say, to properly represent citizens. Elections for the board are often cancelled; when that happens, board members are essentially self-appointed.

Under the plan, certain municipalities/areas of major economic impact that deserve to have their own representative to the district's board would have one.

These are the communities of:

- Fruita
- Palisade
- Grand Junction
- Mesa County unincorporated areas and agricultural land

And the industry of:

Agriculture

"We believe a fresh and much more representative governance model for our communities is a change that leaders of today must recognize as being clearly warranted," they wrote in a letter to the Drainage District board. The letter also was sent to other elected officials and local city/town managers.

"It would seem prudent that we come together as a team for this change and look forward to your participation and cooperation in establishing a stronger governing structure that benefits all in providing the Grand Valley with the tools to meet the challenges ahead."

RE: Legislative proposal to strengthen community representation on Drainage District Board of Directors

Dear Board Members,

It is generally acknowledged that significant challenges face the Grand Valley regarding irrigation return flow and stormwater capacity, as well as federal regulation of stormwater quality.

Since the inception of the District in 1915, many changes have occurred. To adapt to the changes, some legislative modifications have been made, including changing the District's name from the Grand Junction Drainage District to the Grand Valley Drainage District ("the District").

Another legislative modification is needed. It is time that the citizens and their leaders in the Grand Valley address and strengthen the method by which the District is governed.

Since the last legislative adjustments, the District has faced a number of challenges, not the least of which is the dwindling of its revenues. This resulted from a failure to maintain the District's mill levy in the face of TABOR adjustments. The District's monetary reserves have all but been depleted, resulting in the District seeking new sources of revenue in the form of fees. The District estimates that failing to maintain its mill levy revenue has cost it tens of millions of dollars over the last 20 years.

Currently, the three-member board is elected, but on several occasions, the elections have been cancelled due to lack of public interest. In those cases, through no fault of the individual board members, the members have effectively been self-appointed instead of elected. This is less than ideal and is clearly not best practice. Of concern is that this seems to have become a pattern, at a time when the District faces difficult challenges.

As you know, the District includes the communities of Grand Junction, Fruita and Palisade and the unincorporated areas of Mesa County. The District will play a very important role in the Grand Valley's future, including the construction of needed infrastructure. The District has identified at least \$60 million in needed improvements that should be provided over the next 20 to 30 years. While the District controls over \$100 million in assets, it is charged with more and more responsibilities with less and less resources.

It is time to modify the District's board structure to a best practice that will more properly represent the citizens within its boundaries and meet needs well into the future.

Certain municipalities/areas of major economic impact need, deserve and should demand to have their own representative to the District's board.

These are the communities of:

- Fruita
- Palisade
- Grand Junction
- Mesa County unincorporated areas and agricultural land

And the industry of:

Agriculture

The most recent legislation modifying the nature of the District provides: "The purposes for which the District is organized are to construct, operate, and maintain systems of drains and drainage works sufficient to reclaim and protect all lands and property within said district from seepage, waste waters, and storm waters." In spite of this provision, recent District management has maintained that the District's responsibilities are limited to ground water seepage, irrigation return flows and so-called "torrential storm flows."

A recent review of the District's property tax revenue revealed that in 2013, the District collected \$1,396,676 for the 2012 assessment. Of that amount, 97.6 percent of the total revenue was assessed against non-agricultural or urban properties.

To ensure that the District's Board of Directors more appropriately represents the increasingly diverse and wide-ranging interests and needs of the entire Grand Valley, and to ensure that the District Board of Directors continues to be comprised of competent and professional members of the community who are able to meet the complex challenges of the valley-wide drainage issues, we are formally requesting our respective elected City Councils and the Board of County Commissioners to endorse a legislative change to the governance of the District. Furthermore, we request the Legislative delegation to move forward on legislation accomplishing the same. Recommended draft language would be as follows:

37-31-104 – Governance of District

The district shall be managed and controlled by a Board of five members known as the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years and serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. One director shall be appointed each by the respective councils or town boards of 1) City of Grand Junction, 2)City of Fruita, 3)Town of Palisade, and one director shall be appointed by the Mesa County Board of Commissioners. The 5th and remaining director shall be appointed by majority vote of the other four directors. This director appointed by the other four directors shall be a resident of unincorporated Mesa County. The criteria for 5th director's selection shall include a familiarity with and involvement in some form of agriculture in the Grand Valley, and such director will be recognized as the "Agriculture Appointment" to the Board of Directors.

We hope the Drainage District Board shares our belief that the proper model for the governance of the District consists of allowing the respective municipalities, the County and the agriculture community to have representation at the table to address the challenges facing the Grand Valley. We believe the proposed change will transform the governance of the District into a model that reflects the changing composition of the citizenry and its drainage needs, while continuing to honor the original intent of the Colorado Drainage Act of 1911. It will also reflect the purpose of the creation of the District in 1915, the inclusion of the City of Grand Junction and Fruita in 1916, and the change of the name from Grand Junction Drainage District to Grand Valley Drainage District in 2007.

The leaders of yesteryear all acknowledged that with the ongoing growth pressures within the various jurisdictions in the Grand Valley, and the resulting significant future challenges facing the District, the District needed to change, and we believe a fresh and much more representative governance model for our communities is a change that leaders of today must recognize as being clearly warranted.

We consider this matter <u>time sensitive and of critical importance</u>. Furthermore, it would seem prudent that we come together as a team for this change and look forward to your participation and cooperation in establishing a stronger governing structure that benefits all in providing the Grand Valley with the tools to meet the challenges ahead.

It has been stated by all involved, "We don't need a 1915 drainage district. We don't even need a 2015 drainage district. We need a 2050 drainage district." We believe this proposal will put the District on course for 2050.

RESOLUTION ENDORSING A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO TITLE 37 C.R.S CONCERNING STRENGTHENING COMMUNITY REPRESENTATION ON THE BOARD OF THE GRAND VALLEY DRAINAGE DISTRICT

RECITALS: The Grand Valley Drainage District (the "District") contains within its boundaries the communities of Fruita, Grand Junction and Palisade, and unincorporated Mesa County. Since the inception of the District in 1915, many changes have occurred in the communities and in the legal and practical issues related to the management of drainage and the work of the District.

Over those years the District has often cancelled elections for the District's three member board of directors (the "Board"), and otherwise not had the benefit of wide-ranging community involvement on the Board and in District concerns. Because of the complexity of the issues involved with the management of the District, the City Council has determined that it endorses and supports a proposal to amend and strengthen the statutory method by which the District is governed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRUTIA, COLORADO that an amendment of Title 37, Article 31, Section 104, C.R.S., concerning governance of the District, in a form substantially similar to the following proposed amendment, is in the best interest of the City and its residents that are within the District and served by it:

37-31-104 – Governance of District


The district shall be managed and controlled by a Board of five members known as the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years and serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. One director shall be appointed each by the respective councils or town boards of 1) City of Grand Junction, 2)City of Fruita, 3)Town of Palisade, and one director shall be appointed by the Mesa County Board of Commissioners. The 5th and remaining director shall be appointed by majority vote of the other four directors. This director appointed by the other four directors shall be a resident of unincorporated Mesa County. The criteria for 5th director's selection shall include a familiarity with and involvement in some form of agriculture in the Grand Valley, and such director will be recognized as the "Agriculture Appointment" to the Board of Directors.

FURTHERMORE, that the proposed amendment concerning the selection and involvement of persons on the District Board is in the best interest of the greater community and accordingly the City Council recommends that the proposed amendment be brought to the Colorado General Assembly for consideration and passage in the 2015 – 2016 session.
