### **Tuesday's City Council Meeting**

On the agenda is the appointment of the next Police Chief, an update on the status of 2017 capital projects, a presentation from local rancher Kathryn Bedell on "Food Matters" and my semi-annual review, among a variety of consent agenda items.

#### **Police Chief Recruitment**

The Police Chief hiring assessments were all completed this week with heads of local law enforcement, representatives from the Police Commission and City Council, leadership staff and Police Department staff and myself. I am excited about how they went and have on the agenda to request City Council approval of my appointment of Lt. Dave Krouse to be the next Chief effective April 4, 2017, following Chief Macy's retirement. It was clear through the process that Lt. Krouse is ready and has the education, experience, internal/external relationships and support, skills and knowledge to be the City of Fruita Police Chief.

- Staff is working on some updates to the City's sewer master plan.
- In our effort to prioritize time on some action items to move the City goals forward, we are in the process of creating three cross-departmental teams to focus on internal/external communication, past + present = future and education and

- healthy community.
- Staff is working on a community meeting for the new Trail Host Program to be on Feb. 22.
- January began with 4 new residential dwelling units permitted, but we have many coming up (full report below).
- January paid visitors at the Community Center for January totaled 17,511 (584 average per day).
- Recreation Staff are discussing possible partnerships with Special Olympics as well as working with AARP regarding a program they have called Age Friendly Community.
- We let the Health Department know we would like to partner with the Communities that Care program.
- We had a great meeting with a new prospective business to Fruita today.
- James Williams is working to line up our Thursday Night Concert Series—can't wait for those!
- We have hired our second Facility Coordinator at the Community Center to have full coverage during all hours.
- Lots of special events on the horizon (listed below).
- CIRSA will be here working with all departments next week.
- Finance staff is staying busy working on year-end work.
- We had a great follow-up call with Slate Communications who thoroughly enjoyed their visit to
  Fruita last week meeting with the FTAC and many locals. They plan to bring a plan to the FTAC this
  month.
- Engineering continues to work through the final details of design for the Riverfront Trail, the alley project, sewer projects and the South Mesa Downtown Phase II design work.
- The next edition of City Link is going to the printer and out in the mail next week.
- We attended the VCB Annual meeting and it is great to see more opportunity arising to track the
  economic impact of outdoor recreation visitors to the area—no surprise of the impact but always
  difficult to obtain data.
- We also had some productive meetings with partners this week including the Fruita Middle School, BLM, CDOT, Ute Water and the Forest Service.
- Parks and Wildlife plan to have their selected contractor to construct their portion of the Little Salt Wash Trail in March.






