We have a special meeting on Tuesday, beginning with honoring and recognizing recent promotions and new hires in our Police Department with a Swearing In Ceremony, followed by a couple of Proclamations & the consent agenda, an update on Community Center debt refinancing process and a grant application to help convert the Business Incubator Center stellite space in the Civic Center to a coworking space. The meeting ends with two executive sessions.

- Fruita and Family Health West have teamed up again to provide a <u>sports</u> <u>physical exam clinic</u> Thursday, June 29 from 5:30 – 7:30 pm.
- Mesa County completed their annual review of gas and oil employees in the area. The employee count for Fruita increased by 13 to 203 for 2017 and decreased from 2,094 to 1,991 in Mesa County.
- The Governor signed the Forfeiture Bill which will limit funds we typically seek from this fund for training and equipment for our police department. He has directed DOLA to establish a taskforce "to develop further reforms and improvements to civic asset forfeiture in Colorado."

- Planning Commission met this week and approved two VRBOs.
- Junior Police Academy began this week.
- Parks and Police staff are working on ways to address the issues occurring each weekend at Snooks Bottom causing lots of trash to clean up and multiple police calls for issues such as fights.
- We had a large irrigation break near Triangle Park that the Parks Dept. worked to fix.
- The Community Center remains very busy.
- We had an HVAC unit go out at the Community Center that is being fixed.
- Due to budget overages in Aquatics in 2016, the Community Center has been implementing the 2015 aquatics schedule to better manage the budget.
- The first Thursday night concert was well attended last night.
- Staff is in full swing with budget meetings beginning the preparation of the 2018 budget.
- Try not to melt this next week—it's going to be hot!


