Tuesday's City Council Meeting

In addition to two proclamations for Housing Resources of Western Colorado and the consent agenda, we have scheduled a discussion on identifying which sections in Chapter 8 of the Land Use Code staff should begin working on updating and an update on an internal process staff have worked on identifying core behaviors to replace and update our core values.

Fruita Filming

Vitality Films was in town Wednesday filming Grand Day 2.0 where they were repelling to the Colorado River from the Kokopelli Trails, stand up paddle boarding, eating pizza and fishing at Snooks Bottom. Great Outdoors Colorado also arrived Wednesday to film thru Friday in production of a documentary highlight video of the construction of the Kokpelli section of the Riverfront Trail. They spent this trip doing many interviews along future sections of the trail and highlighting some of the outdoor recreation in the area. They will be back in the fall for their staff retreat and more filming. We just received the final cut of the Fruita Fat Tire Festival.

TID BITS:

- We had the pre-bid meeting for the I-70 lift station secondary force main installation (in advance of the Kokopelli section of the Riverfront Trail construction) this week that was well attended with a good selection of prospective bidders.
 - Bid opening for the above is next Wednesday.
 - Busiest May ever at the Community Center with paid visits.
 - Over 200 kids signed up for the Dinomites Summer Camp.
 - Busy Memorial weekend at Snooks bottom. No major issues but 1.5 hours of cleaning up trash.
 - In April, Fruita residents recycled 44 tons of cans, bottles, paper, and cardboard (see full report below).
 - Trailhosts collected tickets at the first Riverfront Concert series last week and

- We had a decent turnout of interested residents at the Communities that Cares open house last night.
- Staff has been busy preparing for Mike the Headless Chicken Festival.
- I can hear the chickens upstairs—we will have over 200 show chickens in the Civic Center over the weekend.
- Met with the Economic Development partners and shared current activities and how we can partner.
- They are working on a regional Grand Valley brand.
- The Business Incubator is assisting us with a Certified Small Business Community grant with OEDIT for \$30,000 and no match to convert our Civic Center BIC space into a co-working space.
- The BIC also successfully assisted a local with a grant application they were awarded to pursue a confidential business plan for the community!
- Junior Police Academy is accepting applications and will run June 14-19 on Wednesday nights.
- We are working on a new City sign at the rodeo in the stadium.
- Turns out there was some camping at Enoch Lake over the weekend and also some burglaries at nearby private property that the Sheriff's Office is handling.
- Tickets are available for purchase for the Community Dinner (June 21) at the Civic Center. The dinner will be in Civic Center Park from 6:30-9:00 pm and those serving report at 6:15. Adults are \$10 each and children \$5 each.




