Coronavirus Update

• MCPH Begins Administering 3rd Dose of COVID-19 Vaccine to Immunocompromised Individuals. From Mesa County Public Health (MCPH) this week: After approval from the Food and Drug Administration and guidance from Centers for Disease Control, Mesa County Public Health will administer third/booster doses of Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines to immunocompromised individuals beginning Wednesday, August 18. The CDC recommends people whose immune systems are moderately to severely compromised receive an additional m-RNA COVID-19 vaccine at least four weeks after their second doses. Additional doses are free. No ID, insurance, or proof of medical history is required to receive an additional dose. The full release from MCPH can be found here.

We had a great group and good discussion around the outdoor dining space, current development occurring in Fruita, and other City projects. - *GJEP Board Retreat.* On Wednesday, Councilor Breman and I participated in an all-day Board Retreat for the Grand Junction Economic Partnership (GJEP) focused on the organization's vision and mission.
- Meeting with Food Bank of the Rockies. This morning, Sue Ellen Roberts, the Executive Director of Food Bank of the Rockies, provided a presentation to staff and I on the new facility for the organization. It was great to hear from Sue Ellen and to learn more about the current efforts of the organization. The Food Bank of the Rockies is a great partner, and we are thankful for all of their efforts in Fruita and the valley. We will be scheduling a brief update to City Council in September.
- **Roundabout Completion.** Today, the final four pieces of artwork created by local artist Jeff Bates were installed. They look great! Apples to soon be added to the apple tree. Definitely worth a special drive around to check them out.
- Other Partner Coordination. Busy week meeting with valley partners and agencies on housing, broadband, opioid funding governance, discussions around total maximum daily loads of stormwater, and prospective business relocations. More to come.

- The heavy rain caused flooding on both the Little and Big Salt Wash trails which crews were able to clean up Friday morning.
- In consultation with Fish and Wildlife, the extreme heat and lack of oxygen in Snooks Bottom Lake caused a number to fish to die and may be noticed by visitors for a few days.
