Monday's City Council Special Meeting & Workshop

A quick reminder, the special City Council Meeting and the January Workshop are scheduled for Monday night. There is only one item on the agenda for the special meeting, and that is for the Council to consider a resolution creating a Fruita Housing Authority. After the special meeting, we will adjourn into the January workshop, where we will discuss reoccurring proclamations, housing strategies, and the Council will hear an update on the upcoming election.

Highway 6&50 Sewer Replacement Project Update

The Hwy 6&50 sewer line replacement project continues, and Plum Street is now fully open providing access to Wave and Fiesta Guadalajara. S. Mesa Street (between McCune and Highway 6&50) will remain fully closed through the weekend and through next week (January 24th – Jan. 31st) depending on soil conditions. The city would like to thank the businesses, Wave and Fiesta Guadalajara, for their understanding and patience during construction.

Next week, construction will move out into Hwy. 6&50 to avoid conflict with several underground utilities. Please be advised there will be intermittent closures on Hwy. 6&50 for the next several weeks and we encourage people to use detour routes. Please slow down and use caution when traveling through this area and please support those businesses who have been impacted by this construction project.

Thank you to M.A. Construction for continuing to maintain safe practices and a safe job site.

General Updates

• Wayfinding Project. The maps for the wayfinding project are scheduled to be installed today throughout Fruita. After that, the contractor will be installing several color-coded bike and pedestrian signs along the routes, and the project will be complete. - Internet and Phone Outage. On Monday, there was a long internet and phone outage at all City facilities that started around 1:00 p.m. Both services were restored around 8:30 p.m. on Monday night. We apologize if we missed any calls from residents during the outage!
- DOLA Meeting. Staff and I met with our Co. Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) Regional
 Manager to discuss grants and the upcoming funding cycle for the Energy Impact Assistance
 Fund (EIAF). We anticipate that we will be applying for an EIAF Grant this cycle for one of the
 capital projects that is included in the 2022 budget. The cycle is open until March 1st, and any
 grant that we apply for will go before the City Council for approval and support.
- GJ Ride Magazine. Parks and Recreation Director Marc Mancuso and I participated in a planning
 meeting for this year's edition of Ride Magazine. Ride Magazine is published annually by the
 Daily Sentinel, and we recommended potential articles that may be of interest to readers.
 Specifically, the new wayfinding system installed throughout Fruita, the success of the Co2UT
 Race and gravel riding in Fruita, the new trails being built out at the North Fruita Desert, and
 more.

 Watershed Plan. Staff met this week with other local agencies to discuss the Grand Valley Watershed Plan. Draft materials will be available in the coming weeks.

Parks and Recreation

- Night at the FCC tonight is Canceled. Unfortunately, due to the rising COVID-19 cases in the community, we have decided to cancel the January 21, 2022, Night at the FCC. The next one is scheduled for March 4, 2022.
- **CARA Basketball Challenge.** The Cara Basketball Skills Challenge (formally known as the Denver Nuggets Skills Challenge) was very successful and there are 4 first place winners that have the opportunity to participate at sectionals.
- **Youth Co-ed Volleyball and Youth Basketball.** Practices for youth Co-Ed Volleyball and Youth Basketball have begun with the first games taking place on January 29th.
- Sweetheart Run, 5k/10k. The Sweetheart Run is on February 12, 2022, at the Fruita Community Center at 10:00 a.m. You can register until February 9th at the Fruita Community Center (FCC). The entry fee is \$25 for 5k and the 10k is \$30. First 400 registered participants receive a custom Sweetheart race shirt. The 5k race starts promptly at 10:15 am, the 10k will start promptly at 10:00 am. This year the Sweetheart race will be taking on a new course! We are utilizing Fruita's nature and running on the Riverfront Trail. There will be course marshals and aid station along the trail to help you with the transition. Public Works

- Work with GVDD. Public Works staff is working with Grand Valley Drainage District (GVDD) and Insituform on the Ottley/Holly Park drain line and right-of-way permits.
- **Building Maintenance Update.** Building Maintenance working with a contractor to repair the five load centers for equipment plug-in in Public Works yard. BM is working with Parks and Rec for state bid purchasing of custodial supplies. Using the state bid purchasing system, may drastically reduce costs for these supplies.
- Road Maintenance Update. Road Maintenance staff continue to support the Hwy 6 sewer project by delivering materials to job sites. Staff completed potholes on 19 Rd. From Hwy 6 to J Road, removed snow from the alley between Peach St. And Mulberry St. On north side of Aspen, installed city limit sign on west side of city, cold patched Plum St. for sewer project.
- **Fleet Maintenance Update**. Fleet staff has documents prepared to order replacement vehicle for 1-ton truck and is working on the replacement vehicle for combination mag/sand plow/dump vehicle. Staff is working on fuel site inspection standard operating procedures and have completed several preventative maintenance items.
- Collections Update. Collections crew continue with training on lift stations and Vactor truck, repair of irrigation trash cleaners, removed grease from I-70 lift station, cleaned and adjusted we well levels and transducer settings at I-70 lift station, cleaned vacuum priming chambers at all lift stations and completed 48 utility locates.
- Wastewater Treatment Update. Staff completed maintenance projects including cleaning and calibrating probes, oil samples taken from influent pumps, transfer pumps and motive pumps

- for evaluation. Staff is working to compile data and reporting for biosolids and annual Infiltration and inflow report.
- **PW Administration Update.** Staff met with engineers to discuss capital projects for the wastewater treatment plant and collections system. Met with the Colorado Department of Local Affairs to discuss grant funding opportunities.
