2022 Regular Municipal Election Information for City Council Candidates

The City of Fruita regular municipal election will be held on April 5, 2022, and will be conducted by mail ballot. If you are interested in running for a position on the City Council, petitions for candidate nominations may be picked up from the City Clerk's Office beginning on January 4, 2022, and completed petitions must be filed with the City Clerk by January 24, 2022. Highway 6&50 Sewer Replacement Project Beginning Next Week

Construction of the Highway 6&50 sewer line is scheduled to begin next week. As we previously detailed, drivers should expect detours and delays as construction begins. There will be a full closure of Plum Street (at Highway 6&50) next week and Mesa Street may also be closed. Staff is making contact with and striving to keep affected businesses up to date. Temporary message boards have been set up along the highway notifying drivers of the upcoming construction. The contractor will be working in the upcoming months installing a new sewer line and manholes on or around Highway 6&50 between Plum Street and Grand Avenue. Public Works Continues to Respond to Snow/Winter Weather Conditions

Snow was a welcome sight to the Grand Valley and it looks like we received our fair share. Street crews are equipped for snow removal operations to make sure our transportation system remains safe and accessible. The city has prioritized critical arterials such as commercial corridors, school routes, and emergency services. Once the priority routes are clear, crews will begin hauling snow off that has accumulated downtown and around the fire station as staff and equipment become available. Public Works does not plow or remove ice from subdivisions as that can cause additional issues with driveways being blocked and cars parked along the street. If you have a dangerous situation within your subdivision, please contact the Public Works Department at 970-858-9558 and we will apply sand and salt on the ice.

In addition, the city needs your help to protect pedestrians from possible injury. When residents fail to clear snow and ice from their sidewalks, it forces pedestrians to walk on snow and ice-packed sidewalks or even in the street. Fruita Municipal Code Section 12.16.010 requires any person owning or occupying any store or business property in the city contiguous to any sidewalk, to remove any snow or ice from the sidewalk within two hours after the storm has ended. Fruita Municipal Code Section 9.01.029 requires owners, or his agent, or the occupant of any premises or property in the city to maintain those sidewalks adjoining such premises or property in a condition free from snow, ice, mud, dirt, rubbish and filth. Any accumulation of snow and ice shall be removed from such sidewalk into the street within twenty-four (24) hours after every snowfall. Please pile snow in your yard – not in the street where it will block the flow of drainage. When icy conditions exist, we urge people to please slow down and drive with caution. We appreciate all property owners who help keep the community safe.

- **Fleet Services.** Replacement of the 1-ton truck is ready to order and Public Works is waiting for an updated quote for replacement of the plow truck. Fleet is also working on a fuel site inspection standard operating procedure.
