Tuesday's City Council Meeting

Our meeting on Tuesday will begin with a proclamation for Arbor Day in the City of Fruita. After that, the Council will consider seven items on the consent agenda, before moving on to public hearings. We have three public hearings on the agenda, and the first is to discuss a special event liquor license for the Museum After Hours event at Dinosaur Journey. The second is on short-term rental limitations, and the third is on amending the Fruita Municipal Code concerning penalty for violations of the code. See you all on Tuesday night!

Highway 6&50 Sewer Replacement Project Update

Paving on Highway 6&50 should be complete by the middle of next week with street striping to follow. It is anticipated that most, if not all, of Hwy. 6&50 will be open by Friday evening but there may be additional paving and striping next week near Mesa St. and in some of the parking lots along Hwy. 6&50. Thank you to M.A. Construction for continuing to maintain safe practices and a safe job site.

Municipal Election Next Tuesday

The City of Fruita will conduct its regular Municipal Election next Tuesday, April 5, 2022, by mail ballot. As a reminder, all voted ballots must be returned to the Fruita Civic Center by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Voters can drop off ballots at the drop-off box in the Civic Center parking lot, or at the drop box inside the Civic Center. Public Works

- **Building Maintenance Update.** Building Maintenance staff have completed the monthly inspections of each City-owned building's fire system lights for CIRSA. The crew supervisor is beginning to gather data from all HVAC units to enter into our work order system to begin tracking the life cycle of each asset.
- **Fleet Maintenance Update.** Fleet staff completed the repair of the motor grader. They have started to disassemble snow removal implements from vehicles.
- Road Maintenance Update. Road Maintenance staff completed the cleaning of all irrigation ditches throughout the city and pulled debris out of the Little Salt Wash. Raymond Mikhail has been awarded a Spring Street Conference Scholarship to attend the 2022 Spring Street Conference on April 19th and 20th. Raymond wrote an essay describing how attendance at this conference would boost his experience in the Public Works field and provide benefit to the City of Fruita. Congratulations Raymond!!

- **Collections Update.** Collections staff completed a force main and pump repair for Heritage Park. All HWY 6 sewer inspections have been completed. 56 utility locates have been completed.
- Admin Update. Public Works Director attended the Grand Valley Regional Transportation
 Committee meeting. Participated in Work Order system training across two days. Participated in
 a micro-trenching discussion with City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, participated in Capital
 Improvement Planning discussion, and met with USFS to discuss the NRCS Watershed Program.
