Honor the Past – Envision the Future $\begin{cases} FRUITA \end{cases}$

- **Question**: Why is there property called the Fruita Division of the Grand Mesa National Forest?
- Answer: The City of Fruita owns four reservoirs on the Pinion Mesa near Glade Park, CO.
 Historically, (prior to 1980) these reservoirs supplied domestic water to Fruita. As Fruita
 grew, the water from the reservoirs was not sufficient for Fruita. Today, these reservoirs
 are for recreational use and deliver water to the Glade Park area for irrigation. To learn

Police Department

• Junior Citizen Police Academy. The Fruita Police Department is bringing back the Junior Citizen Police Academy! This program is for 12-17 year olds interested in learning about what it's like to

be a Police Officer. Students will learn about DUI detection and enforcement, crime scene investigation, and the importance of community involvement. This is a great opportunity for youths and officers to build a stronger relationship with each other. Applications can be picked up at the Fruita Police Department at 101 W McCune Ave. The academy is every Thursday from July 7-28 from 2 pm –4 pm. The flyer for the program can be found below.

Public Works

- Building Maintenance Update. Building Maintenance staff completed HVAC repairs at the city shop and have rented a scissor lift to begin multiple projects for the shop and police department.
- **Fleet Update.** Fleet staff completed several vehicle maintenance items. Staff repaired a hydraulic leak on a tractor and replaced a water pump and battery on the street saw trailer. The street sweeper had new suction liners and tires installed. Staff also performed a service and tire repair.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Road Maintenance staff completed asphalt patching on S. Maple St. and performed a saw cut on Peach St. & Elm St. for future asphalt patching. They have also been working on right-of-way mowing and weed spraying.
- Utilities Update. The utilities crew flushed the Apple St. irrigation line and responded to 6 citizen irrigation calls. They cleaned and flushed downtown storm drains. Orchard Ridge #4 sewer lines were cleaned and inspected. 19 utility locates were performed.

121 Cubic Yards of Landfill Airspace

Enough airspace to fulfill the annual municipal waste disposal needs for 154 people!

103,975 Kw-Hrs of Electricity

Enough power to fulfill the annual electricity needs of 9 homes!

Avoided 117 Metric Tons (MTCO2E) of GHG Emissions

This GHG reduction is equivalent to removing annual emissions from 25 passenger vehicles!

224,358 Gallons of Water

Represents enough saved water to meet the daily fresh water needs of 2,991 people!


