## Fruita City Council Accepting Applications for One Vacancy

The City of Fruita City Council is currently accepting applications to fill one vacant Councilmember position. Applications will be accepted until Thursday, September 22 by 5:00 p.m., and the Fruita City Council will conduct in-person interviews for the position on October 10, 2022. ## Bike Park Construction Slated to Begin September 19, 2022

Beginning September 19, 2022, the Fruita Bike Park will be closed to the public for renovations. The trail building team from Singletrack Trails will start the process of updating and adding new features to the park. Given the amount of use, there has been wear to some of the features as well as erosion from weather. To keep the park in a desired condition, reworking some of the elements is required. The project will provide a more durable and longer-lasting set of features and make it more attractive to the users of the bike park. The project is expected to be complete by the end of October. We ask the community to please respect the closure so crews can work safely and efficiently to get the construction done and the bike park back open to the public. We are excited to see this project begin!

#### **Busy Weekend in Fruita!**

It's going to be a busy weekend in Fruita. Tonight, is the last Food Truck Friday of the season at Reed Park today from 5:30~pm-8:30~pm. There will be a variety of food options, live music, a beer garden, and more! ## Sidewalk Grinding Begins Monday, September 12.

As part of the larger 2022 Sidewalk Replacement Project, crews will begin the sidewalk grinding portion of the project next week. The sidewalk grinding is expected

- Question: How do I find out when City Council meets and what's on the agenda?
- Answer: Fruita City Council meets on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of each month. Regular City Council meetings begin at 7 p.m. and City Council Workshops begin at 6:30 p.m. in the Fruita Civic Center Council Chambers. A full calendar of meetings can be found online at fruita.org. ## **General Updates**

- Fruita Area Chamber of Commerce Business After Hours. Enjoyed attending this event hosted
  by Family Health West's Physical Therapy Department who walked us through interactive trials
  of their equipment and services. It was very informative and such a great resource in the
  community.
- Update on EV Charging Stations Project. Last week, staff applied for and was granted an extension for the \$75,000 grant the City received from the Colorado Energy Office for our EV Charging Stations project at the Civic Center. Unfortunately, this project has been delayed due to the availability of materials, and due to the design needed for the electric upgrades to accommodate the stations. The grant was extended until April of next year, and the project will be carried over in the 2023 Budget.

#### Engineering

• **Pine Street Bridge Closure Beginning October 3, 2022.** A full road closure at the Pine Street Bridge north of K.4 Road and south of K.6 Road will begin on October 3, 2022 and will last through June 2023. During the closure, the bridge will undergo a full replacement and necessary safety enhancements by widening the bridge to three lanes, installing a curb, gutters, and a five-foot wide sidewalk on each side of the bridge. #### **Public Works**

- Building Maintenance Update. Staff continued to work on replacing swamp cooler pads and
  removing calcium buildup from swamp cooler units at the shop. They are working on correcting
  any fire inspection issues for City owned buildings.
- **Fleet Maintenance Update.** A flat tire was repaired for the WWRF mower. A Parks ATV had a new gearbox installed for its broom attachment. The paint striper was cleaned due to pressure loss. Multiple inspections and services were completed.
- Road Maintenance Update. Staff painted the Civic Center parking lot and shop parking lot. Alley
  maintenance behind Copper Club and Base Camp was completed. They also began prepping for
  multiple patches throughout the city. Jesse McClaskey and Raymond Mikhail both attended
  traffic control technician training and passed their exams. Congratulations Jesse and Raymond!
- Utilities Update. Staff installed bollards at I-70 lift station to secure their valve exerciser. They cleaned inspection bulbs at IIG due to alarm call outs. Electrical repairs and a utility transfer switch replacement were completed at the Raptor Rd. lift station. Staff completed CIRSA training for traffic control and CDOT flagging.
- Wastewater Treatment Update. With the new fabric cover for their storage outbuilding, the crew is busy organizing their space.
- Admin Update. Public Works Director met with a representative from Waterworth to discuss financial management for wastewater system. Reviewed past maintenance of alleyways and reviewed current allocation of water shares in the irrigation system.



**Pine Street Bridge Closure Recommended Detour**
