- The Fruita Community Center (FCC) will be open from 7 a.m. 7 p.m.
- Monday is the last day of the season for the FCC outdoor pool! The pool will close at 6:30 p.m.
- Trash and recycling will be delayed by one day next week.

#### **Tuesday's City Council Meeting**

We have no proclamations or presentations scheduled for our meeting on Tuesday night, so the meeting will begin with the City Council considering several items on the consent agenda before moving on to public hearings. There are three quasi-judicial hearing items on the agenda, and those include two special event liquor permit applications and one planning item. For legislative hearing items, we an amendment to the 2023 budget to be considered, and two planning items. Our meeting will conclude with the formal review of the City Attorney. ## **Sidewalk Replacement Project Starts Next Week**

The 2022 sidewalk replacement project is kicking off this week, with most of the work focused on the Heritage Meadows and Village at Country Creek subdivisions.

- Question: What services are offered in the Fruita Civic Center?
- Answer: The Fruita Civic Center is located at 325 East Aspen Avenue in downtown Fruita. Inside you'll find city departments including Administration, Planning, Engineering, Municipal Court, the City Manager, and Human Resources. For help with utility services, visit the Administration window on the first floor. City Council meetings also take place here in the City Council Chambers. In addition, the Department of Motor Vehicles runs an office from the building open on Tuesdays and Thursdays. This building is home to F-Works Co-Working, dance classes, and tons of events that take place outside in Civic Center Park such as Thursday Night Concerts and the Mike the Headless Chicken Festival. • **Sidewalk Replacement Project.** Bids for the Sidewalk Replacement Project closed last Friday, August 26<sup>th</sup>. We received two bids with the lowest bid being \$91,214. There is \$100,000 budgeted for this project, so staff may look at other areas to complete as part of the program.

#### **Public Works**

- **Building Maintenance Update.** The Lower Valley Fire District completed fire inspections at the Public Works Shop, Civic Center, and Police Department.
- **Fleet Maintenance Update.** Fleet staff replaced the thermostat in the asphalt roller and performed multiple equipment and vehicle services.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Staff patched on Jasper Dr. and Mica Dr. Thermal plastic was repaired on Ottley Ave. and Coulson St. They have also proceeded with Right of Way mowing and street sweeping.
- **Utilities Update.** Staff began training sessions with our newest crew member on the Vactor truck. They trimmed trees near David Ct. to clear a walking path. 50 locates were completed.
- Admin Update. Public Works Director attended a Grand Valley Stakeholder meeting with the
  Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment regarding Total Maximum Daily
  Loads(TMDL). Public Works staff met with a representative from Hensel Phelps who was
  selected as the city's Construction Manager at Risk to discuss the H2S Mitigation Project for the
  sewer system. Attended a webinar on doing more with less and the importance of being
  proactive in maintenance. Completed and submitted the Department of Local Affairs Energy
  Impact Assistance Grant for the WWRF Aeration System project. Notice of awards will happen

- sometime in December. The Public Works Superintendent position has been posted and will close on September 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Wastewater Treatment Update. WeatherPort has completed the installation of a fabric roof
  replacement for one of the Wastewater outbuildings. Staff have been working on reducing
  polymer costs for the autothermal thermophilic aerobic digestion (ATAD) system. So far this
  summer, pounds per ton of polymer have been reduced by 35% compared to wintertime
  operations. One of the clarifiers will be taken down for maintenance and repair.


